

Clerk's Report to Warham Parish Council – 19 November 2020

Shortly after the last meeting I had a letter from a lady in Burnham Market complaining about the “removal of a wooden bridge” on the Marsh north of Warham Greens. As far as I am aware there have been no usable wooden bridges there for decades – only the metal, wildfowlers’ bridge. I advised her of this, but she was adamant that her wooden bridge existed “a few weeks ago”. I referred her to the Footpaths Section of NCC, and at the moment, have heard no more!

I have included a section on the agenda regarding “speeding in the village” following the correspondence with Sue Lane that I shared with you at the time. I do not think that there is much that can be done about this except perhaps to encourage a *Speedwatch* group if there are several people in the village who feel strongly about it. The possibility of “entry gates” was raised at the time, but this would be quite expensive for a small community like Warham and I personally believe that there are so many of them around now that their initial effectiveness has been lost – a bit like flashing radar signs. I have put the item on the agenda in the hope that you are more-aware than I could be of local feeling.
